

As-Built End Items (Application Logic Review)

Overview

In the past, there has been some ambiguity with regard to the use of the terminology “end item” in the context of CMPRO’s As-Built module. With the release of build C-BN-0116, this uncertainty was removed. For reporting and export purposes, the definition of an end item was established to be “an item that has no next higher part.” Behind the scenes, this definition also established the programming logic by which a part’s end item flag would be set to **Yes**. As a result, CMPRO users involved with the tracking and management of end items will see greater accuracy between various reporting and export features related to As-Built end-item data.

Details

As part of build C-BN-0116, PSA made it easier for users to visually identify end items on screen in the As-Built module with the appearance of the bolded and all-capitalized text “END ITEM,” included in parentheses at the end of the item’s **Part Number** field.

Recently, PSA also conducted an important review of application logic. The review’s intent was to reaffirm that items in CMPRO meeting the criteria mentioned above are properly flagged as end items. As such, all data, search screens, reports, and exports involving the tracking and management of end items in CMPRO should now reflect an improved degree of accuracy and consistency.
